- ✓ Big Idea: God has definite ideas about what a church servant-leader should look like.

Elders

References:

- ✓ Philippians 1:1
- ✓ 1 Timothy 3:1-7
- ✓ Titus 1:5-9

Terminology:

The one office is described in the NT by 3 terms (cf. Acts 20:17, 28; 1 Peter 5:1-4):

- ✓ Elder (πρεσβύτερος "presbyterian") → stresses wisdom (age) and maturity (from OT Jewish clan leaders)
- ✓ Shepherd (ποιμήν "pastor") → stresses the servant, ministry aspect
- ✓ Overseer (ἐπίσκοπος "bishop")→ stresses the function of the office, i.e. guarding against heresy

Qualifications: **1 Timothy 3:1-7

Calling (verse 1)

➤ He must *desire* the position

- **Character** (verses 2-7)
 - > **Reputation** (*Kent Hughes)
 - Blameless/above reproach:
 - He must not be open to criticism concerning his moral conduct

> Marriage/Relationships

- Husband of one wife:
 - Literally "a one woman man"
 - He must be faithful and committed to his wife (this includes no divorce while a Christian, see verses 4-5)

> Self-Mastery

- Temperate/vigilant:
 - He must have an attitude of self-control and clarity of mind (not controlled by anything other than Christ)

Sober-minded/self-controlled/prudent/sober:

- Literally "a sound or healthy mind"
- He must have a level-headed perspective on the world that results in an orderly life
- Good behavior/respectable:
 - Literally "well arranged"
 - · He must be disciplined and honorable in his actions

> Ministry

- Hospitable:
 - Literally "a lover of strangers"
 - He must be a kind and gracious host

- Able to teach:
 - He must understand and be able to convey basic Christian truths

≻ Temperance

- *Not given to wine/drunkenness/addicted to wine*:
 - Literally "near wine"
 - He must not be a drunkard or dependent upon alcohol

> Temperament

- Not violent/pugnacious/a striker:
 - He must not be quarrelsome or eager to fight (not an angry person)

• Gentle/patient:

- He must be considerate of other opinions and look reasonably at facts
- Not quarrelsome/a brawler:
 - Literally "without fighting"
 - He must not be full of passion and fight

> Money

- Not greedy for money/filthy lucre: (NKJV v. 3)
 - Not in NU
 - He must not be greedy or into dishonest, secular money schemes
- Not covetous/lover of money:
 - Literally "not loving money"
 - He must not be greedy, envious, or materialistic

> Family

- Rules his own house well/manage his family well:
 - Literally "to stand before/lead/attend to beautifully"
 - He must be a loving, servant-leader and head of his household
- Having his children in submission/obedience/control:
 - Literally "to rank under with all respect"
 - He must be a loving parent that is responsible for his children (including discipline)

> Maturity

- Not a novice/recent convert/new convert:
 - Literally "newly planted"
 - He must not be a baby Christian in that he does not understand his servant-leadership role (pride and conceit might rear its ugly head...)

Reputation (Again!)

- Have a good testimony among those outside/good reputation with outsiders:
 - He must have a solid witness in the community (that is attractive to unbelievers)

Deacons

Terminology:

The office of deacon in the NT (most likely) started in Acts 6:1-7:

✓ Deacon (διάκονος "servant, helper")→ concerned with hands-on ministry that emphasizes taking care of physical needs in the congregation (whatever the elders delegate to them)

The Acts

"Origin" **Acts 6:1-7

The Attributes

Deacon qualifications are important just like elder's \sim "likewise" (v. 8)

> Respected

- Reverent/worthy of respect/men of dignity/grave:
 - He must be honorable and worthy of respect
- Not double-tongued/sincere:
 - Literally "two words"
 - He must not say one thing and mean another (hypocrite) or give different versions of the story to different people
- Not given to/indulging in/addicted to much wine:
 - Literally "paying attention to much wine"
 - He must be responsible with alcohol and not controlled by it
- Not greedy for money/pursuing dishonest gain/fond of sordid gain/greedy of filthy lucre:
 - Literally "shameful gain"
 - He must not be greedy or into dishonest, secular money schemes

➤ Convinced

- Holding the mystery/deep truths of the faith with a pure/clear conscience:
 - He must be doctrinally sound

> Tested

- First be proved/tested:
 - He must have a reputation and record of faithful service in the local church
- Blameless/nothing against them/beyond reproach:
 - Literally "not called up (for trial)"
 - He must not be accused of any wrongdoing

≻ Help-Mated

- Their wives must be:
 - Reverent/worthy of respect/dignified/grave:
 - She must be honorable
 - Not slanderers/malicious talkers/gossips:
 - Literally "devils"
 - She must not criticize or find fault
 - Temperate/sober:
 - She must have an attitude of self-control and clarity of mind (not controlled by anything other than Christ)
 - Faithful in all things/trustworthy in everything:
 - Literally "full of faith"
 - She must be reliable and dependable

> Domesticated

- Husband of one wife:
 - Literally "a one woman man"
 - He must be faithful and committed to his wife (this includes no divorce while a Christian, see verses 4-5)

• Ruling/managing his children and own house well:

- Literally "to stand before/lead/attend to beautifully"
- He must be a loving, servant-leader and head of his household (including children)

The Awards

- > Faithful service as a deacon carries with it the promises of verse 13.
